NUPOC Gallery: Exhibition Space

NUPOC aims to improve the quality of life for persons who live with a physical impairment. The NUPOC Gallery is prominently located in the NUPOC foyer, where it is accessible to researchers, educators, students, patients, administrators and guests of Northwestern University. The NUPOC Gallery recognizes the artistry that is intrinsic to Prosthetics and Orthotics and the inter-relatedness of science, technology and art.

NUPOC invites Artists to submit images of their original work for consideration. We welcome diverse media, styles and thematic content. The art work does not need to be related to science.

Dimensions of Exhibit Space

The exhibit space is neutral white. Note the exhibit space dimensions:

- 1) The exhibit wall is in a recessed alcove, 21-feet long and 52-inches high
- 2) The recessed alcove is 16.75-inches deep (at 21-inches from the ceiling and 23-inches from the floor)
- 3) The exhibit space features five (5) equidistant top lights

Hanging System

Ten (10) adjustable J-hooks are available to hang from a securely fastened top rail. Each J-hook hanger has 33-lb weight tolerance.

Submission of Artworks for Consideration

As space allows, NUPOC accepts framed, ready-to-hang paintings, prints, photographs, and mixed media. Sculptures are acceptable depending on size and weight. Thematic and stylistic unity is welcome, but not required.

Please submit samples of artwork as JPG or PNG images. Or, provide a link to your online portfolio to <u>rgarrick@northwestern.edu</u>. Alternatively, call R. J. Garrick, PhD, at 312.503.5700 to make an appointment for portfolio presentation. NUPOC reserves the right to review, select, or reject exhibition pieces in its sole discretion.

Duration of Exhibit

Exhibits are shown for two (2) months, depending on the schedules of NUPOC and the Artist.

Supporting Materials

NUPOC works with Artists to develop exhibit text, museum tags, Biographical Sketch or Artist Statement and a digital photograph of the Artist. Exhibit tags identify each work by size, title, date, media, price and, if available, additional information about the intent, meaning, and creative circumstances.

Publicity

NUPOC will disseminate information about the Artist and his/her exhibit on the <u>NUPOC website</u> and on the Northwestern University public events calendar, <u>Plan-it-Purple</u>. NUPOC Gallery is not a sales point; however, Artists are welcome to make their and their gallery's contact information available so that interested parties can contact them directly.
